Affordable Housing Investments

 Invested more than \$20 billion in affordable housing

Building Capacity for Housing and Services and Preventing Homelessness

 Community Care Expansion: \$100.27 million to fund 19 projects to create more residential care options for older adults and people with disabilities

Expanded from six to 15 communities, with 9 emerging

Protecting Older Adults & People with Disabilities from Abuse and Neglect:

• Expanded Eligibility for Adult Protective Services from 65 to 60
